A Letter From The Head of School

2017-18 was an exciting and productive year at Saint Andrew's United Methodist Day School, marked by the strong collaboration between home and school that is such an important part of our community:

- With your help we were able to raise funds to improve our facilities in important ways. 2017-18 saw the launch our new MakerSpace. This exciting resource has quickly become a hub of creative learning and collaborative problem-solving that is enjoyed by all of our students. Parent support also enabled us to resurface the blacktop on our playground, much to the delight of our students. Funds from the Parent-Faculty Association spring event allowed us to address a long-stand teacher request by installing ceiling-mounted digital projectors in all of our classrooms during the summer of 2018.
- 🦠 PFA support enabled us to establish a new initiative to advance the professional growth and development of our talented faculty: Summer Study Grants. This summer, sixteen different teachers received financial support to participate in ten different professional development experiences. Project topics ranged from from instructional technology, to Service Learning, to character and study-skills development and are sure to help keep the Saint Andrew's experience engaging for our students.
- Parent volunteers continued to be an important part of our students' education. By chaperoning field trips to places like Williamsburg, the Smithsonian American History Museum, and the National Zoo our parents allowed us to take advantage of the remarkable learning opportunities that are available in our area. Parents were instrumental in helping us present traditional events like our Earth Day celebration and Grandparents' & Special Friends' Day, as well as new programs like the Empty Bowls Project.
- Our efforts to achieve optimal enrollment targets also benefited from ongoing parent support. As in previous years, most of our new families found their way to us after speaking with current families about their positive experiences here at Saint Andrew's. Of course, we continue to look for ways to spread the good news about our school in the Annapolis area. To that end, during the 2017-18 school year we engaged the services of Herrmann Advertising to create a new marketing plan for Saint Andrew's. Commencing with its roll-out in the fall of 2018, our newly refreshed branding materials and carefully crafted messaging will help us raise our profile among prospective families.

In closing, I want to thank you for your ongoing support for Saint Andrew's and for your willingness to join in the important work of creating a school that serves the needs of all of our students.






2017 Saint Andrew's Open






Elementary School Science Fair
